

Topic – week beginning 01.06.2020

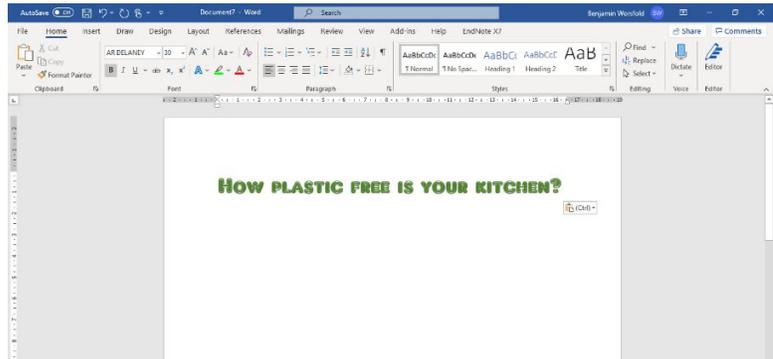
Hi Year 5!

How are you? I we're going to do Computing this week. As always, I'll give you some different options of activities to do so you can pick and choose and do them in the order that you want to.

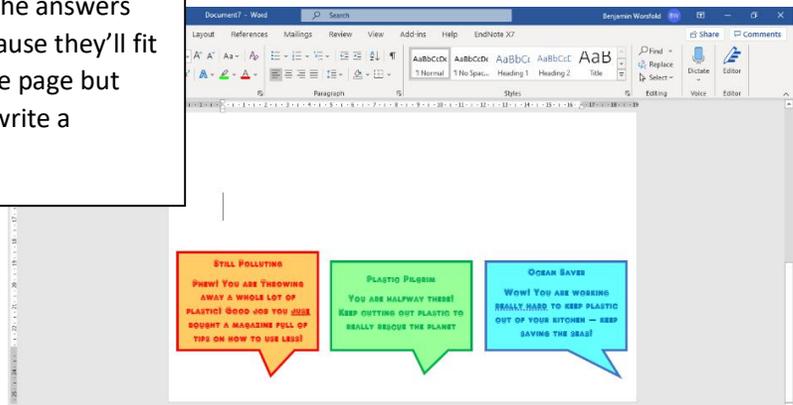
The yellow activity will work better later in the week because they link to the English work but for all the others it doesn't matter what order you do them in.

<p>BBC bitesize You can follow the link below or just type in BBC bitesize KS2 computing (KS2 stands for Key stage 2) into your search engine.</p> <p>They have about 9 different video links all about different aspects of computing that you can watch and explore.</p> <p>https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/subjects/zvnrq6f</p>	
<p>You can use Espresso coding from home just like we have been using it in school. 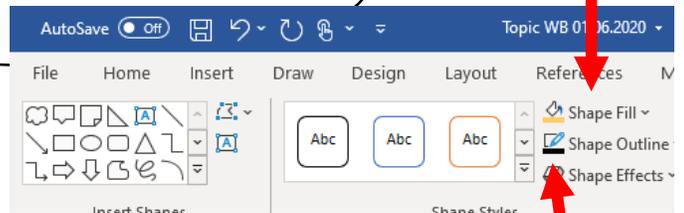
First, choose a question that your flow chart will answer.



Secondly, decide what the answers will be – I did three because they'll fit across the bottom of the page but leave enough space to write a description.

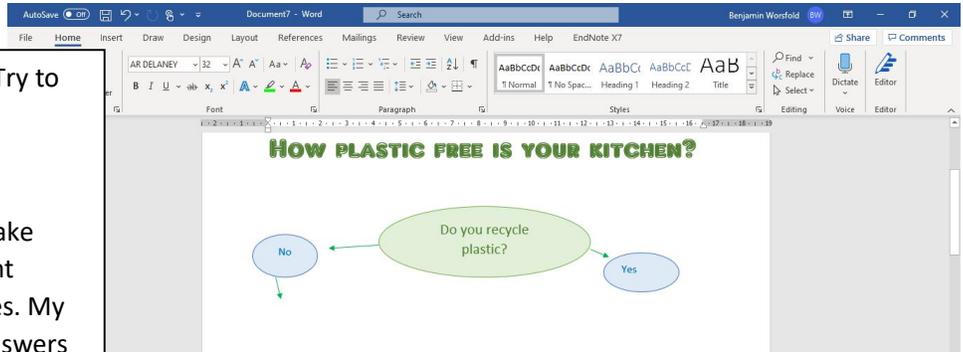


Extra hint – to make these speech bubbles, choose "insert" on the bar at the top of Word and then just change the fill colour and the outline colour for each one.



Next, pick your first question. Try to start with an easy one!

Use the fill buttons again to make your answer bubbles a different colour to your question bubbles. My questions are green and my answers are blue.



Write questions and answers that will take your reader all the way to one answer.

My first one takes the reader all the way to "Ocean Saver"

They have to answer three questions to get there.

The answers that don't show you are saving the ocean take you back to other questions.
