TODAY'S TASK- Make your own posters for our musical words


Lento – this Italian word is used in music to mean **SLOW**

Legato – this Italian word means **SMOOTHLY**


Allegro – this word means **LIVELY** and **FASTER**

Staccato – **SHORT** and **CHOPPY**


LENTO/SLOW
