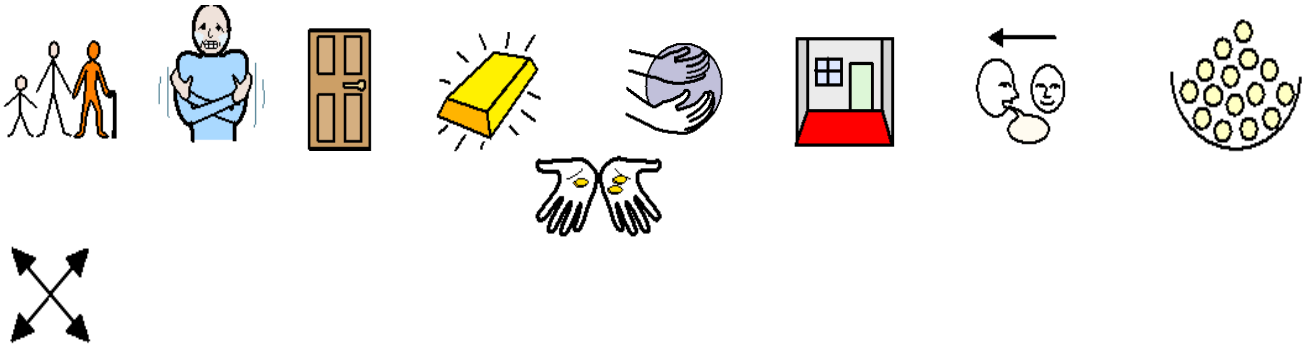

L.O. To use adverbs to show 'how' and 'when'

Lots of adverbs we have looked at tell us **how** something is done eg.

**Quickly, I shut the door** or **I shut the door quickly.**

However, some adverbs tell us **when** something is done eg.

**Afterwards, I went home** or **I went home afterwards.**
