




William Shakespeare is regarded as one of the world's greatest writers. Through his works, he is credited with introducing nearly 3,000 words to the English language. Read this short biography and answer the questions below in full sentences.

William Shakespeare

Baptised 26 April 1564 - died 23 April 1616



William Shakespeare was born in Stratford-upon-Avon in Warwickshire. No one knows when he was born but the records of Stratford's Holy Trinity Church say he was baptised on 26 April 1564.

In his early school years he studied Maths, Religion, Literature and Latin. At the age of 18, he married a woman called Anne Hathaway, the daughter of a farmer. A year after they were married, they had a daughter together and then had twins in 1585. Their names were Susanna, Hamnet and Judith. Very little is known about Shakespeare's activities from 1585 - 1592. During this period he went to London where he began a successful career as an actor and writer.

In his lifetime, he wrote 38 plays, 154 sonnets and many poems. Today, his plays still excite audiences of all nationalities.

Shakespeare's most famous plays include *Macbeth*, *Hamlet*, *Romeo and Juliet* and *A Midsummer Night's Dream*.

Shakespeare retired to Stratford a few years before his death. He died on 23 April 1616. He was buried at the Holy Trinity Church two days after his death.

The epitaph written on Shakespeare's stone slab is written below:

Old spelling:

*Good frend for Iesvs sake forbear,
To digg the dvst enclosed heare.
Bleste be ye man yt spares thes stones,
And cvrst be he yt moves my bones.*

Modern spelling:

*"Good friend, for Jesus' sake forbear,"
"To dig the dust enclosed here."
"Blessed be the man that spares these stones,"
"And cursed be he who moves my bones."*
