

Maths activity – 6.7.20

Number

To start

Ask your child to fill in the missing digits to complete this grid showing all of the 10s numbers up to 20. You could talk about how the first number in each tells you how many tens there are. If you can't print the page, help your child write the 10s numbers to 100 on a piece of paper.

Should

Ask your child to cut out and then order the numbers up to 40. If you can't print the sheet, they could write the numbers to 40 in order, copying from the grid here if they need help with what the numbers look like. They might find that it helps to first group the numbers into their 10s groups (eg. All the 20s together, all the 30s together etc.) and to then look at the 1s column to decide how to order each group.

Could

If your child would like a challenge, you could ask them to mix the numbers back up and then arrange them in reverse order, starting with 40 and working back down to 1.
