Activities

Write the correct calculation for each word problem eg $4 + 5$. I have underlined the key word to help you. Work out the answer however you like- you might want to use the bottom of the page to draw tens and ones, or pots.

Question	Calculation	Answer
I bought 5 boxes of apples. In each box there were 6 apples. How many apples were there <u>altogether</u> ?		
Sara ate 3 sweets, Sacha ate 5 sweets and Lucy ate 7 sweets. How many did eat in <u>total</u> ?		
I had 40 pages in my book. I read 10 of them. How many did I have <u>left</u> to read?		
I ordered 15 sets of pencils for school. I <u>shared</u> them between three classes. How many did each class get?		

Challenge (you don't **need** to complete this- only if you have some extra time)

Have a go at this word problem. You will have to write more than one calculation. Try to break it up into steps.
