

ICT – Using Mathematics at school and at home to practice our key maths skills.	<p>To be able to count to 20 (verbally and counting groups of objects).</p> <p>To recognise odd and even numbers.</p> <p>To be able to say one more and one less than a number to 20.</p> <p>To be able to solve an addition problem by counting on.</p> <p>To be able to solve a subtraction problem by counting back.</p> <p>To be able to write numbers to 20.</p>	<p>Odd numbers: An odd number is a number that cannot be divided into two equal groups. Odd numbers end in 1, 3, 5, 7, 9.</p> <p>Even numbers: An even number is a number than can be divided into two equal groups. Even numbers end in 0, 2, 4, 6, 8.</p> <p>Counting on: method of addition to start from the biggest number and count up from there.</p> <p>Counting back: method of learning subtraction by taking away the smaller number from the larger number by counting back from the larger number.</p>
