Fairness – impartial and just treatment or behaviour without favouritism or discrimination. Climate justice – finding ding solutions to the climate crisis in a way which creates a fairer, more just and more equal world in the process. Equality – providing equal opportunities to everyone and protecting people from being discriminated against. Influence– an effect of one person or thing on another. Repent - to be very sorry for something bad you have done in the past and wish that you had not done it Grace – in the Bible, Grace is about receiving unfailing love when it is undeserved. Redemption - the action of saving or being saved from sin, error, or evil.
